

Health Matters Physical and Mental

DUCT TAPE FOR WARTS?

Heretofore, the most effective over-the-counter treatment for common warts has been salicylic acid. Would you believe that now researchers are touting duct tape? In studies of children and young adults with warts on their hands and feet, it was found that a small piece of ordinary duct tape applied to the affected area was even more effective in eliminating the warts than cryotherapy (freezing them with liquid nitrogen).

Patients applied the duct tape as follows: six days on the wart; remove for one night; a new piece for another six days; remove for one night, etc. After two months, 85 percent of the duct-tape group had complete resolution of their warts, compared to only 60 percent of the cryotherapy group.

Researchers believe that the local irritation caused by the duct tape stimulates the immune system to fight off the viral infection responsible for the warts.

Compared to cryotherapy, which is often painful and may require several office visits, duct tape applied at home caused only minor skin irritation.

OTC SEXUAL ENHANCEMENT PRODUCTS

Since the FDA approval of Viagra in 1998, a number of over-the-counter products have also come on the scene. Advertisers promise to "spice up your life," "rekindle desire," and "improve sexual performance" with everything from amino acids, such as L-Arginine, to herbs made from the bark of a West African evergreen tree.

Unfortunately, as of now there is no well-established evidence that any over-the-counter treatments for male impotence or female sexual dysfunction are effective.

Cold War Certificates Still Available

Service members, veterans and federal employees who served between September 2, 1945 and December 26, 1991 are still eligible for a Cold War Recognition Certificate.

An application for the Cold War Recognition Certificate can be found on the internet at <https://coldwar.army.mil>


