In November we traditionally honor our members who have served in the military.

Our Song Sirs will sing their tribute to veterans who have served in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard and the Merchant

Marine.

This year we will also do a special recognition to those members who served during World War II.

Our guest speaker this month is City of Concord Councilman Dan Helix, Korean War Veteran, Retired Major General US Army, two-time Mayor of the City of Concord and co-chair of the Community Advisory Committee for the Concord Naval Weapons Station Reuse Project.

Dan enlisted in the Army as a private in 1948. In 1951 he was commissioned as a second lieutenant and was assigned as a platoon leader in Korea, where he distinguished himself as commander of a rifle company. It was during this time that he earned the majority of his more than 25 medals. Among these are the Combat Infantryman Badge, Purple Heart with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Silver Star, the Bronze Star with V device for valor, the Army Distinguished Service Medal and the Meritorious Service Medal. Dan retired from the Army as a Major General in 1989 following an impressive career spanning 41 years.

Dan recently completed his second term as mayor of the City of Concord.

He also was mayor and served on the Concord City Council in the late 60's through the mid-70's.








Old Money Poker







Book Corner



The salmon

season has wound down but we finished strongly. **Stewart Davis** and **Joe D'Angelo** caught limits on party boats. **Romano Gnusti** traveled to British Columbia and landed a batch of silver salmon while **Steve Paulick** had

similar success in Alaska. **Tom Kostik** and **Kent Cremolini** landed both salmon and steelhead on a trip to the Klamath River in northern California. **Pete Gates**, **Tom Boltz** and **Brad Hatcher**, all Branch 146 members, fished the delta with a guide for salmon and came home with an 11 pounder.

Some of us traveled far and wide to seek out fish other than salmon. **Ron Maciak** caught black bass on a trip to Lake Okeechobee in Florida and a three pound trout in Yosemite. In Lake Tahoe, **Chuck Vanoncini** caught limits of kokanee in several outings. **Kent Cremolini** made his annual trek to San Diego for a five day outing in the ocean off the Baja coast and came home with a cooler full of yellowtail and dorado.

We also did well locally, both catching and eating. In the eating department, nearly 50 of us joined the Branch 8 SIRs in the Kitchen group for the annual food orgy at the home of **Ed Benson**. 




