October's Attendance: We consumed and paid for 215 meals at our October luncheon. We had guaranteed payment for 205 meals, setting the kitchen's commitment at 216. 206 of those meals were

served to members of Branch 146, equaling 71.7% of our membership. We experienced only 11 No Shows, 13 fewer than September's luncheon. The 3.8 No Show percentage was almost as low as any we've had during the past two years. Seven, 22%, of the timely notifiers were Advance Payers. It is a boon to the treasury when an Advance Payer gives timely notice of non-attendance. Of course, I strive to have the number of meals consumed and paid for fall somewhere between the number we guarantee and the kitchen's commitment. Therefore, I was pleased with the outcome at this luncheon.

November Luncheon: Please note on your calendars that our next regular monthly meeting will be held on THURSDAY, November 10th, 2016 at the Boundary Oak Golf Course Club House in Walnut Creek. The price of the luncheon is \$26 and there will be the usual no-host bar. The assembly will be called to order at 11:45 am. Please allow enough time to check in and make payment. The preferred form of payment is a check made payable to "SIR 146" delivered when you check in on luncheon day. REMEMBER, WE ASSUME YOU ARE COMING AND YOU WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE LUNCH COUNT SUBMITTED TO BOUNDARY UNLESS YOU TIMELY NOTIFY US THAT YOU ARE NOT.

A Word to the Wise: Regular members missing 3 consecutive luncheon meetings without notifying the attendance chairman prior to the deadline for the luncheon or attending less than 5 regular luncheon meetings in the last 12 months will receive a letter notifying them of pending membership termination. Certification of another branch meeting will be considered as credit to the attendance record. Is the November luncheon your last chance to make 5 luncheons this year?

Opt Out Deadline for November Luncheon: Please remember that your deadline to opt out of the November luncheon is NOON ON FRIDAY NOVEMBER 4TH. We will e-blast reminders of this deadline during the preceding week. Nevertheless, you would do well to mark it on your calendar right now. If you are unable to

attend, please send an e-mail message to "nolunchbranch146@gmail.com" before that deadline ("no show deadline"). Please provide your badge number in that message. If you do not have convenient access to a computer please call (925) 979-5146 before the no show deadline and follow the prompts given there. A non attending member who without good cause fails to meet this deadline is required by our rules to reimburse the Branch for the liability we will incur for his meal, in this case \$26. We appreciate the "Advance Payers" who timely notify us that they cannot attend a luncheon. As noted above, this courtesy results in an economic benefit to our Branch. A REMINDER TO ADVANCE PAYERS: BE CERTAIN TO CHECK IN.



Special Requests: If your guest desires a vegetarian meal or a special diet or if, for medical reasons, he cannot eat lunch please so advise before the opt out deadline in the manner as described above.

New members along with their sponsors will be asked to join our Membership Chair immediately following the luncheon for a brief orientation session in a room to be announced at the luncheon.





New Event Opportunity

Anyone for pickle ball?
What's that, you say?



"Three things to know about pickle ball. It's fun, it's good exercise, and it has nothing to do with pickles. As legend has it, the curious name was coined in 1965 by a group of Dads near Seattle who came up with a game that combined elements of tennis, badminton and table tennis to entertain their kids. A dog named Pickles got into the act by chasing the balls, and, well, a backstory was born." [Angela Hill, writer for the Bay Area News Group].

Pickle ball is one of the fastest growing sports for all ages, particularly seniors. It has seen a re-growth over the last decade that rivals bocce ball. It is played on a court the size of a badminton court (20' x 44') and does not require a player to cover large amounts of space, particularly if it is played in doubles format, which most often it is. It has become quite the rage among seniors and is able to provide a very healthy and fun exercise without taxing your body to a significant degree. The net is set at a height of 36" similar to a tennis net. In addition, it has a "no volley zone" which is 7 feet from the net and this prevents a player from being able to get too close and smash the ball over the net easily from a close distance.

The paddle is approximately 8" wide x 15" long with a handle made of wood or a composite material.

The ball used is a "whiffle" ball but is slightly heavier than what we remember from our childhood days when we played baseball with a white whiffle ball, or now one we might use for golf practice.

I am encouraging our branch members to think about starting a pickle ball activity and, perhaps, eventually to develop a "SIR Pickle Ball League" in which branches would compete against each other. From a personal and prejudicial viewpoint, the church that my wife and I attend in Alamo (San Ramon Valley United Methodist Church) has become the recipient of a very generous anonymous gift sufficient to build a new gymnasium on our church campus located at 902 Danville Blvd. in Alamo. Pickle ball is one of several sports that will be featured and we are anxious to recruit pickle ball users to our facility at a very nominal fee (i.e., \$4 for a three-hour period which allows you to play as many games as you can, depending upon the demand from the number of players wishing to participate). Construction of the gymnasium known as the "Athletic & Recreation Center," or ARC, is well underway and we expect to open for business in either late 1Q, or early 2Q, 2017.




